

**Policy Title:** English Standards

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### 1. INTENT

This policy defines the minimum English standards required for entry into ECU award courses.

### 2. ORGANISATIONAL SCOPE

This policy applies to all ECU staff, students and prospective students. The policy relates to all course awards offered by ECU in the [Australian Qualifications Framework](#), which includes higher education course awards and vocational education and training (VET) course awards.

#### 4. POLICY CONTENT

- 4.1 To gain admission to an ECU award course, prospective students must satisfy the minimum English standard requirements as set down in [Table 2 English Entry Pathways, English Language Test Requirements](#). If a student is unable to meet the specific requirements, but is able to demonstrate competency in English in another way, special consideration may be given by the Academic Registrar.
- 4.2 Exceptions to the ECU English competency requirements for admission must be endorsed by Academic Services Committee and referred to Academic Board for approval and such exceptions are listed in [Table 2 English Entry Pathways, English Language Test Requirements](#).
- 4.3 [Table 2 English Entry Pathways, English Language Test Requirements](#) is reviewed on an annual basis, early in the second half of the year by the Academic Registrar. Amendments proposed by the Academic Registrar must be endorsed by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) with responsibility for academic matters and approved amendments reported to the Manager, Academic Governance and Standards.
- 4.4 The Manager, Academic Governance and Standards is responsible for maintaining the [English Entry Pathways, English Language Test Requirements](#) and the Academic Registrar is responsible for the proper application of the requirements set down in the Framework.
- 4.5 English language programs provided by external institutions are assessed in accordance with [Assessing English Language Programs of External Institutions Procedure \(Attachment 1\)](#). Student successfully completing an approved English language program is considered to have satisfied ECU's English language competency requirements into an undergraduate or postgraduate course.

## Attachment 1: Process for Assessing English Language Programs of External Institutions

### Introduction

These guidelines provide an assessment process for all external institutions (governmental and non-governmental) offering English language programs, where the institution submits a request for Edith Cowan University to recognise the English competency of students successfully completing its program(s) as satisfying Edith Cowan University's English entry requirements for ECU undergraduate or postgraduate courses.

### Process for Assessing Applications

1. Applications are received by the Manager, Admissions, Student Services Centre, Edith Cowan University.
2. The Manager, Admissions completes a thorough check of the institution and checks that all required course information has been submitted.
3. The Manager, Admissions then provides a detailed report and recommendation using the English Language Program Assessment Form to the English Review Group comprising the Chair of the Education Committee, an ECU senior academic staff member with relevant TESOL expertise (nominated by the Chair of the Education Committee) and the Director of the Student Services Centre, for consideration.
4. The decision of the English Review Group is then submitted to the Education Committee for endorsement and referral to Academic Board for approval.
5. The institution is notified of the outcome by the Manager, Admissions and results are placed on the Precedent database.

### Duration

Recognition of an English language program as meeting the ECU minimum English standard requirements for entry will be made initially for a maximum of five years.

### Documentation to be submitted

An institution requesting ECU recognition of English competency based on the results achieved by students in its own English language program is required to submit detailed documentation with respect to the English language program being offered. In addition, the submitting institution is required to identify the assessment processes that are used and how cut off scores have been determined.

### Additional documentation which may be requested

### **Site Visits**

A site visit may be undertaken at the discretion of the committee when a determination cannot be made based on the documentation provided.

### **Assessment Fee**

An assessment fee, calculated on a fee for service basis may be levied on the applicant institution. The fee will be communicated to the applicant institution prior to final consideration of the application.
